New York, NY, June 12, 2025— El Museo del Barrio hosted its annual Gala on Wednesday, June 11 at The Pool, located in the iconic Seagram Building in New York City. This year's event honored late artist and arts patron **Tony Bechara**, whose visionary leadership and extraordinary contributions helped shape El Museo into the national and international cultural institution it is today.

El Museo del Barrio's 2025 Gala brought together artists, philanthropists, and community members to celebrate Tony Bechara's extraordinary life and legacy. The gala successfully raised **\$1.1 million** in support of El Museo del Barrio's exhibitions, educational programs, and the preservation of its permanent collection.

The evening included a special musical performance by renowned Puerto Rican opera singer Larisa Martínez and a poem read by Presidential Inaugural poet Richard Blanco, as well as an auction—hosted by Sotheby's—which included over 25 exceptional works from preeminent Latin American and Latinx artists and the world's leading galleries. Guests of the event enjoyed a selection of smooth cocktails from Dobel Tequila, followed by a toast moment with Dobel's newest limited edition Extra Añejo release: Dobel Atelier Animales Endémicos Edition.

ABOUT THE HONOREE

Tony Bechara (1942–2025) was born in Puerto Rico in 1942 and lived and worked in New York City for most of his life. He attended Georgetown Law School and New York University, and later studied at the Sorbonne in Paris and the New York School of Visual Art. In the 1970s and 80s, Bechara was included in exhibitions organized by the Boulder, Colorado based Criss-Cross pattern printing collective and featured work in the group exhibition 'Islamic Allusions' at the Alternative Museum in New York. In 1980 he received a fellowship from the National Endowment for the Arts. Bechara has had solo exhibitions at El Museo del Barrio, New York in 1988; Alternative Museum in 1988; Artists Space in New York in 1993 and el Museo del Arte Puerto Rico in 2008. Recently, Bechara has participated in exhibitions 'With Pleasure: Pattern and Decoration in American Art, 1972-1985; Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles, CA, (2019), which travelled to the Hessel Museum of Art, CCS Bard, Annandale-on-Hudson, NY, (2021); 'Point of Departure: Abstraction 1958-Present', Sheldon Museum of Art, Lincoln, NE (2021); and 'Artists Choose Parrish", Parrish Art Museum, NY, (2023). His work can be found in numerous public and private collections including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, NY; El Museo del Barrio, NY; Museo de Arte de Puerto Rico and the Sheldon Museum of Art, University of Nebraska, NE.



In addition to his work as an artist, Bechara was a devoted arts advocate and community leader. He served on the boards of many leading cultural organizations including the Brooklyn Academy of Music, Instituto Cervantes, and Studio in a School. His commitment to El Museo del Barrio was especially profound: he joined the Board of Trustees in 1993, became Co-Chair in 1997, and served as Board Chair from 2000 to 2015. In 2016, he was named Chairman Emeritus in honor of his exemplary service and steadfast dedication to the institution.
